

Ken Fayle has been conducting choirs since he was 14 years old, when he took up the baton in the House Singing Competition at Rossall School, near Fleetwood – a famous victory. Since then he has led many choirs, and has been the conductor of the Frodsham & District Choral Society from 1999 until early July 2007.

A keen singer, Ken often deputises as a tenor for other local choirs, and has also appeared on BBC TV and Radio with Chester Cathedral Choir.

He lives in Cheshire with his wife and four sons, all of his sons having been Cathedral Choristers at Chester. His eldest son, Peter, has worked with the FDSC both as a soloist and an accompanist, and he is currently a Choral Scholar at Magdalen College, Oxford.

Ken is Organist and Choirmaster at St Laurences' Church, Frodsham, and is also Director of Music for Cantoris. He has composed many pieces of music to the words of Colin Gordon-Farleigh, and is also responsible for arranging and directing the choral music recorded onto the CD's produced under the Sheer Joy label.
